## NOTICE OF CONTINUATION OF THE CALIFORNIA SEA URCHIN COMMISSION AS A JOINT DIVER-HANDLER COMMISSION

## TO ALL INTERESTED PARTIES:

The California Department of Food and Agriculture (Department) held a public hearing on November 19, 2018 in Sacramento, California to consider the continuation of the California Sea Urchin Commission (Commission) as a diver-hander commission. A hearing is required under the Commission Law to be conducted every five years to provide an opportunity for sea urchin divers and other interested parties to comment on the usefulness and effectiveness of the Commission.

Based on the testimony and evidence received during the hearing process, the Department found that a substantial question existed among sea urchin divers and handlers as to whether the Commission should be continued. Therefore, the Department conducted a referendum of divers and handlers to determine whether the California Sea Urchin Commission is to continue as a diver-handler commission for the next five years. The referendum voting period was December 17, 2018 through February 15, 2019.

The results of the referendum were as follows: out of a list of 163 eligible divers, 93 submitted valid ballots and of those submitting ballots, 75 voted in favor of continuance, representing an approval of 80.6% of those voting in the referendum, with those voting in favor representing 83% of the volume voted; and out of a list of 17 eligible handlers, 10 submitted valid ballots and of those submitting ballots, 9 voted in favor of continuance, representing an approval of 90% of those voting in the referendum, with those voting in favor representing 99.3% of the volume voted. Based on this vote of approval, the California Department of Food and Agriculture has authorized the Commission to operate for another five years as a joint diver-handler commission.
