## Re: Support for Funding for Service-Based Budget Review for the California Department of Fish and Wildlife

Dear Senator Wieckowski and Assemblymember Bloom,

We write to strongly urge your support for one-time \$2 million allocation to complete service-based budgeting for the California Department and Fish and Wildlife (CDFW).

CDFW is responsible for managing California's diverse fish, wildlife, and plant resources, and the habitats upon which they depend, for their ecological values and for their use and enjoyment by the public. CDFW's significant responsibilities are compounded by growing challenges including impacts associated with human population growth, urbanization, and climate change.

To date, CDFW has not had a formalized way to prioritize across its many responsibilities, which presents significant challenges in prioritizing across its annual budget needs and communicating with the public, legislators, and partners. The current service-based budgeting initiative, as outlined in SB 854, enables CDFW to evaluate its current programs and spending, create a much-needed framework for meeting its statutory mandates, engage with stakeholders and the public, prioritize actions, and evaluate budgetary and human resources needs.

We have seen the benefits of service-based budgeting, as the California Department of Parks and Recreation went through a similar process in 2015-2017 and created a more transparent, responsive, and efficient budgetary process for California's state parks. CDFW is positioned to complete their service-based budget in the next two years and has already begun departmental evaluations and stakeholder engagement through funding allocated in the 2018-19 budget.

Through this additional one-time allocation, CDFW can complete their service-based budget, institutionalize the tool to address ongoing budgeting needs, train staff to use service-based budgeting, support stakeholder engagement, and present outcomes to the Legislature in January 2021 as mandated under SB 854.

Our organizations represent a diverse set of voices and stakeholders and do not always agree on policy or funding issues. However, we all view successful completion of CDFW's service-based budgeting effort as a critical step towards enhancing California's natural resource management. We urge your support for funding this process through its completion.
